## **EDUCATION AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT SUBCOMMITTEE**

#### **Position Statement**

We recognize and appreciate the support and commitment to education by the legislature. Quality education and training is a priority, it is the key to the success of economic prosperity. We encourage the Legislature to implement and fund proven programs for educating our future workforce and creating the framework for future generations to enter and excel in the job market. We support the objective of Utah school children ranking in the top ten in all fundamental subjects and in graduation rates. We encourage the Legislature to promote achievement in traditional education subjects and in career and technical education in order for Utah students and businesses to remain globally competitive.

## **Support Funding for Education**

We support improving the quality and quantity of educational outcomes. Secure and sustained funding should support growth, higher achievement, improved instruction, and more effective programs to generate higher graduation and completion rates. We encourage the Legislature to consider our education systems, crafting a balanced approach to community growth and density.

## **Quality Education is a Priority**

We recognize that education is the very foundation on which Utah will build its business strength and vitality. We support the Utah State Board of Education and the Utah System of Higher Education's (USHE) efforts to adopt and improve high standards for student learning. ## **Jobs for Economic Prosperity**

Meeting the needs of Utah businesses is a principal goal of ChamberWest. Any company wishing to begin, expand or relocate to Utah requires a dedicated, well-trained workforce in order to be successful. We support stronger ties between educational entities and the business community. We also support collaborative efforts with government agencies and nonprofit organizations whose programs lead towards enhanced employment and training.
